We express deep appreciation for the shelter ministries of the Sacred Heart and St. Michael Catholic Parishes for their service to homeless men over this past winter. This is a population that is often excluded from services and it is with their goodwill that 12 men are given a safe and warm place to be each night over the winter. We want to thank our partners at these parishes for their ongoing work in coordinating the men's

shelter each winter, but also for the heartfelt support they have given to the men this winter.

The constant care the men were shown over this season literally saved lives -- 12 beds at a time. Countless volunteers from both churches have stepped up to do essential tasks. Both Sacred Heart and St. Michael Catholic Church have literally opened their doors to provide warmth, safety and love in the very rooms that

parishioners come to worship in. In addition, we saw record high numbers of men in the shelter this winter, proving that this is a vital program for our community.

We want to personally thank John Terranova of St. Michael and Gary Steele of Sacred Heart for coordinating volunteers to staff the shelter each night. This is no easy feat. We deeply honor the work of these two amazing men and want to give endless thanks to the volunteers that come back year after year to run the shelter.

Since 1991, he and his peers have endured the elements and faced some tough challenges, especially this past season.
